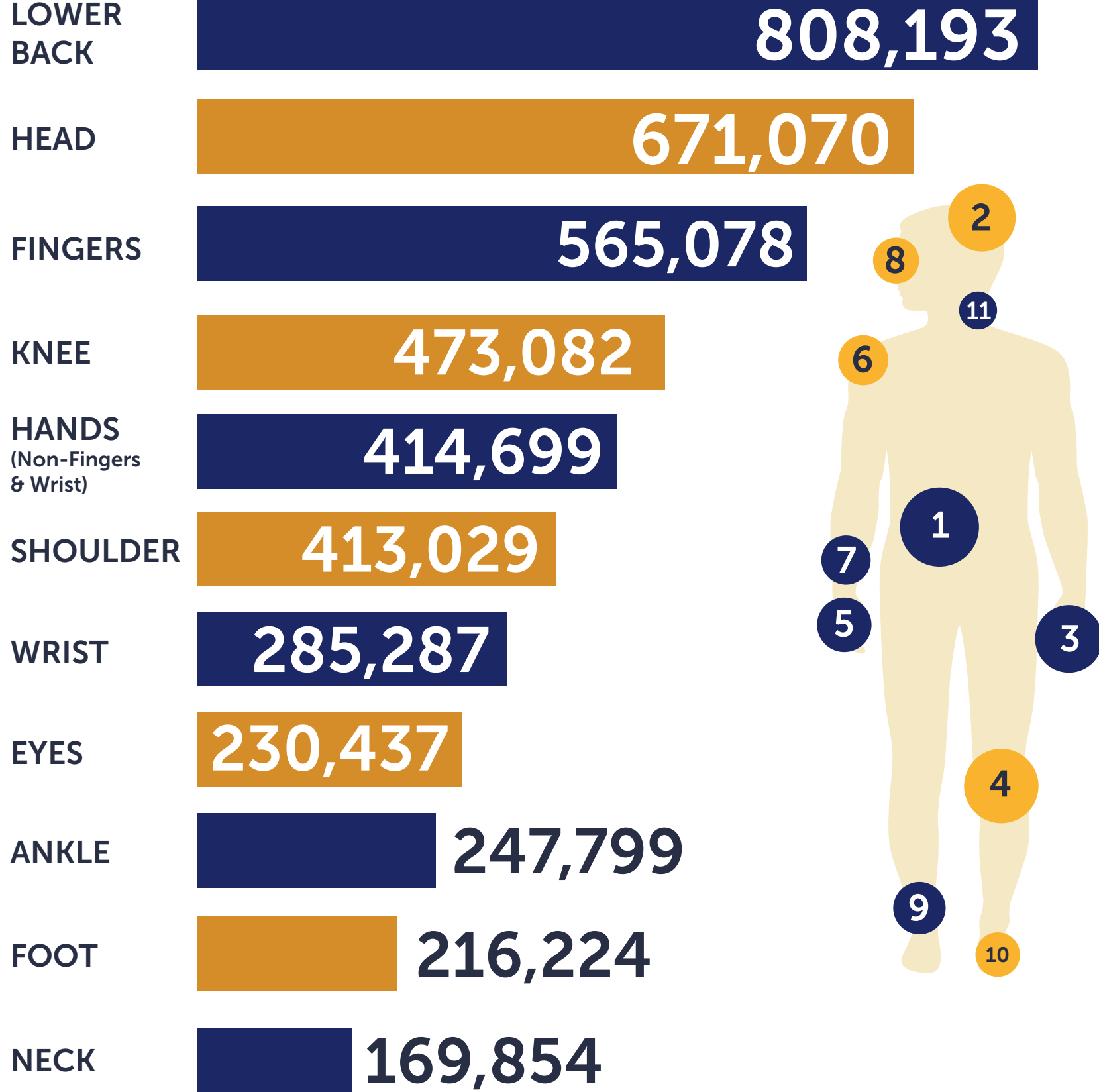

## Top 10 Most Dangerous Jobs in California

Private Employers (2020)

### 1. Nursing and residential care facility workers

12.7 injuries per 10,000 workers (30,300 injuries)

### 2. Hospital workers

9.2 injuries per 10,000 workers (28,200 injuries)

### 3. Couriers and messengers

7.4 injuries per 10,000 workers (7,400 injuries)

### 4. Food manufacturing

6.9 injuries per 10,000 workers (10,600 injuries)

### 5. Museums, historical sites and similar institutions

6.9 injuries per 10,000 workers (900 injuries)

### 6. Wood manufacturing

6.7 injuries per 10,000 workers (1,600 injuries)

### 7. Animal production

6.5 injuries per 10,000 workers (16,500 injuries)

### 8. Food and beverage store workers

5.9 injuries per 10,000 workers (15,300 injuries)

### 9. Plastic and rubber manufacturing

5.7 injuries per 10,000 workers (2,400 injuries)

### 10. Construction

3.5 injuries per 10,000 workers (26,700 injuries)

### 1. Justice, public order and safety activities (state employees)

12 injuries per 10,000 workers (7,000 injuries)

### 2. Museums, historical sites and similar institutions (local government employees)

11.3 injuries per 10,000 workers (200 injuries)

### 3. Leisure and hospitality (local)

9.1 injuries per 10,000 workers (1,300 injuries)

### 4. Hospitals (state)

8.9 injuries per 10,000 workers (3,800 injuries)

### 5. Hospitals (local)

8.9 injuries per 10,000 workers (7,700 injuries)

### 6. Health care and social assistance (state)

8.8 injuries per 10,000 workers (3,900 injuries)

### 7. Public administration (local)

8.8 injuries per 10,000 workers (38,700 injuries)

### 8. Administration of economic programs (state)

8.5 injuries per 10,000 workers (3,400 injuries)

### 9. Arts, entertainment and recreation (local)
